Online Training In-Service Seminars (OTIS)

The Southern Regional Institute & ETTC of The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey has teamed up with Monmouth-Ocean Educational Services Commission to provide you with a wonderful way to complete Statewide Mandatory In-services online.

How OTIS Works

The process is simple. Staff members register through the SRI/ETTC website, www.ettc.net/cal where we process the registration and email to the registrant an individual username, password, and link to access the online course. Once they have accessed the online course each member has 30 days to complete the one hour presentation. A professional development certificate will be issued from the SRI/ETTC office once the participant has completed the course.

The cost of all online courses 1 ETTC Hour per person. Consortium members will be given a credit of 1 ETTC Hour for every 4 staff members who register. This discount is only applicable to Child Abuse/Child Neglect and Bullying & Harassment.

Child Abuse/Child Neglect

This online in-service program on child abuse and neglect is designed for teachers, school counselors, school nurses, special education professionals, administrators, coaches, volunteers, interns, and all other school employees and daycare personnel. The program will inform them about personal responsibilities with regard to the laws dealing with the reporting of child abuse and neglect, a mandatory in-service topic in the state of New Jersey. This program also includes training regarding the new dual-reporting requirement.

New Jersey Administrative Code 6A:16-10.2 (a)6 requires that all School Boards of Education provide annual in-service training to all school employees concerning child abuse.

Illegal Bullying & Harassment

This in-service program on Illegal Harassment and Bullying was created in cooperation with the New Jersey Association of School Administrators. It is designed for teachers, school counselors, nurses, administrators, coaches, and other school and daycare personnel. Upon completing this program you will know the different forms of illegal harassment, the penalties that can be assessed and your role in protecting



yourself and your students from illegal harassment, including reporting requirements.

Title 18A:37-17(b)"...a school district shall: (1) provide training on the school district's harassment, intimidation, or bullying policies to school employees and volunteers who have significant contact with students."

Suicide Prevention

Created in a partnership with Louise Aldrich MSW, LCSW to satisfy the NJ state two hour training requirements are now available! Every 18 minutes someone in the United States has committed suicide. In New Jersey, approximately 77 young people between the ages of 10 and 24 commit suicide per year. Approximately 819 young people per year between the ages of 10 to 24 are admitted to hospitals for non-fatal suicide attempts. Suicide is the third leading cause of death for teenagers. This course satisfies NJ State regulations regarding mandatory in-service training.

Title 18A:6-112 requires "each public school teaching staff member to complete at least two hours of instruction in suicide prevention, to be provided by a licensed health care professional with training and experience in mental health issues, in each professional development period."

The cost of this course is 1 ETTC Hour. For this course Consortium members will be given a credit of 1 ETTC Hour for every two staff members who register.
